Harry Hanson

Harry Oliver Hanson was born Oct. 9, 1918, at White Earth, the son of Carl and Hansena (Garness) Hanson. He was raised and attended school in White Earth. He entered the U.S. Navy and served as a seaman first class during World War II. On Dec. 9, 1939, Harry married Myra Daphne Ness at Miles City, Mont. They lived in Coleharbor, where they owned a hotel and operated Hanson's Ding-aling Circus, and also in Duluth, Minn., where he worked as a welder in the shipyards. He began working at the water plant in Bismarck in 1947 and became the superintendent in 1966. Harry retired in 1979 and continued to live in Bismarck.

Harry was a member of the Sons of Norway and was president of the North Dakota Water Works Association.

Harry is survived by his son and daughter-in-law, H.
